

Associate Dean and Director of Career Development and Student Success

This position provides the vision and strategic direction for the enhancement and implementation of initiatives related to the career services functions for Presbyterian College. As the senior ambassador for career programs and programs that promote student transitions and success, the Associate Dean and Director collaborates with Academic Affairs, Enrollment Management, Alumni Relations, Advancement, Athletics and external constituents to create innovative partnerships, programs and opportunities that will serve students from their admission to PC through their post-graduate careers.

Key Priorities:

- Align the mission and services of the Career and Student Success Center to reflect progressive best practices with measurable results
- Strengthen employer and alumni engagement in recruiting PC students
- Increase the breadth and scope of experiential and post-graduate opportunities in industry, education, entrepreneurial, government and non-profit sectors
- Create a physical space that promotes access to and delivery of career services, academic support, student transitions and student success
- Strengthen employer development/relations efforts to raise PC's reputation as a leading source of student and graduate talent
- Provide programs and services that attract and retain students

Primary Responsibilities:

- Provide visionary leadership, strategic direction and supervision for Career Programs, Internships, Employer Relations, and New Student Orientation programs.
- Plan, manage and oversee an operating and personnel budget for the Career and Student Success Center. The Center's staff includes three professionals and one administrative assistant.
- Serve as the primary liaison between Campus Life and other areas on campus impacting student retention with measurable results.
- Chair the Student Retention Committee requesting and analyzing data, assessing programs and services and reallocating resources for increasing student retention.
- Counsel students experiencing indecision about personal and college-related goals.
- Serve as a Title IX Investigator reporting to the Vice President for Human Resources and Title IX in this duty.
- Assist in coordinating parent programs and the Parents Council Advisory Board.
- Serve as VP for Campus Life Designee as needed. Assume on-call rotation duties for scheduled nights and weekends as well as those when VP is away.

Qualifications and Expectations:

Education: A Master's degree in a discipline related to career development, college student personnel, higher education or human resources.

Experience: A minimum of five years of professional experience and progressively increasing responsibility in career services, student development and/or retention programs.

Skills and Knowledge: The successful candidate will have excellent leadership, supervisory, financial and interpersonal skills, and a demonstrated commitment to students. Ability to lead strategic planning, experience in data gathering and analysis, and experience in employer development are essential.

Other Requirements: This position involves night and weekend responsibilities which require the Associate Dean and Director to live in close proximity to the campus.
