

Student Professional Development Advisor

The **Bryan School of Business and Economics** at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro is accepting applications for a full-time **Student Professional Development Advisor**. The position's primary responsibility is to advise students and organize student professional development activities.

Responsibilities for this position include organizing/teaching an introductory business course focused on professional development, overseeing the undergraduate professional development program, and implementing/overseeing use of a system to track student professional development activities. The employee shall also oversee the creation, logistics and assessment of professional development activities. This includes some programs in existence, as well as creating additional programs (as deemed necessary) to support student professional development. The position may require supervision of student workers or graduate assistants in the administration of the program.

Minimum qualification: Applicants must have either a graduate degree in business, education, or a related field **-OR**- a bachelor's degree with the expectation of an earned master's degree in business, education, or a related field by August 1, 2019.
