A master's degree in Student Personnel, Counseling, Higher Education, Business Administration, or related area is required, as well as five years of progressively responsible experience in university career services. A doctoral degree in Student Personnel, Counseling, Higher Education, Business Administration, or related area is preferred, with ten years of progressively responsible experience in university career services.
